Learning Center and Resource Specialist Program

Structure	Push-in and pull-out service in close collaboration with the General Education Teachers. Class and group size varies as students are served both in the General Education setting and in small groups in the Learning Center. Grade levels may be mixed in the Learning Center. Students may look like they are going to a different setting. Similar to K-5.	One full class period devoted to direct instruction on small groups of students. One education specialist and one paraeducator. Classes are typically around 10-15 students. Students look like they are going to a class like any other class. Grade levels are not mixed. Similar to High School.

504 Plans

- School Counselors are the 504 Case Managers at Ralston
- Assistant Principals are the 504 Case Managers at Sandpiper and Nesbit
- 504 Eligibility includes review of quantitative/qualitative data ie: academic records, observation, health record, etc.
- Eligibility: identified disability that "substantially limits one or more major life activities"
- Parents, Student, Teacher, Counselor & Administrator attend 504 meetings
- Review: annually
- Triannual: Looks at eligibility every 3 years
- Accommodations must be directly linked to the disability
- Teachers are given copy of 504 Plan at beginning of year and when updated
